The Wartburg Community Symphony announces its Holiday Family Concert, and, thanks to a grant from Target's Community Giving Program, invites children and their parents or guardians to attend without charge. The concert begins at **2 p.m., Saturday, December 13**, in Neumann Auditorium, Second Ave. NW at Wartburg Blvd., Waverly.

Dr. Janice Wade, conductor and music director, has chosen a program that promises to be a crowd-pleaser—

A music rendition of Chris van Allsburg's holiday book *Polar Express*, the popular 1986 Caldecott Medal picture book and 2004 movie with Tom Hanks. Soloist is Brian Pfaltzgraff, Wartburg College assistant professor who has been a resident artist with the Toledo (Ohio) Opera.

Narration of "The Ugly Duckling" to the music of Grieg's "Peer Gynt Suite No. 1." Jacqueline Hallbloom, KUNI/KHKE fine arts senior producer, narrates.

Leroy Anderson's "Sleigh Ride" and other holiday favorites.

The Target grant means that children and elementary, junior high, and high school students and their parents or guardians will be admitted free of charge. Tickets for other adults are \$15, and Wartburg College students are admitted with their activity passes.

This grant is part of ongoing efforts by Target to strengthen families and communities throughout the country. Since opening its doors, Target has given 5 percent of its income to organizations that support education, the arts, social services, and volunteerism. Today, that translates to more than \$3 million every week.

The Wartburg Community Symphony is a semi-professional orchestra that includes professional musicians, select Wartburg College students, and area musicians. Members of the symphony orchestra hope that children and their parents or guardians will plan to attend this December 13 concert.
